It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure they are at the correct ring at the correct time. Exhibitors will not be admitted to the ring once a class has started.

NPS Mountain and Moorland Qualifying Rounds:

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of the Shetland Pony Stud Book. Part bred are not eligible.

NPS Membership Criteria Special conditions applying to Breed Shows: Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members and at Breed Shows ponies can qualify for the Final even if their Owners are not NPS members. The highest placed pony will qualify for the Final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line and has not already qualified receives the qualification. Qualification may go no lower than 3rd place.

The Owner of a pony qualifying at a Breed Show must become an NPS Adult / Showing Member for the pony to enter the Final at the NPS Summer Championship Show.

At Breed Shows ponies can win Silver Medal Rosettes even if the Owners are not Members of the NPS but they must become an NPS Adult/ Showing Member to enter the Final. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the Qualification Card goes to the Reserve Champion pony. The Silver Medal Rosette and the Qualification Card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve.
